



Parking Lot Lighting



The Airport, in collaboration with Lower Valley Energy and Energy Conservation Works, worked on a project to replace all of the parking lot lights with efficient LED lights. The total cost for the project was \$91,030. The Airport's share of the project was \$42,000. The Town of Jackson – Energy Mitigation Fund awarded a \$20,515 grant, Energy Conservation works awarded a \$20,515 grant and Lower Valley Energy presented an \$8,000 rebate at the February meeting. The LED lights have motion activated sensors that brighten the light when movement is detected. How cool is that?

Employee Overnight Parking Plan

The Airport is preparing to begin a number of large capital projects and overall improvements. It will take everyone's cooperation and patience to complete these projects.

The Airport recognizes some of the benefits that it currently provides today will be impacted and has decided to set up a comparable program. The airport will be subsidizing the Ride2Fly Program for badged or furloughed employee as a free alternative to parking overnight. This will not impact daily operations and should not be used for daily travel.

Beginning March 11th, there will no longer be free overnight parking on airport premises for employees. However, if employees are traveling for business on behalf of the Airport, overnight parking will be allowed with proper credentials that can be obtained from you supervisor or manager.

Starting March 1st, the airport will be providing all badged employees Ride2Fly services for overnight usage.

Employees will need to book a reservation 24 hours in advance for Ride2Fly by calling Jackson Hole Shuttle at (307) 200-1400.

Please have your SIDA badge with you to utilize this service and remember there is a two week overnight parking limit at the Town Parking garage.
