JH Airport Board Announces Runway Reconstruction and Related Projects for the Spring of 2022

Jackson, Wyoming – At its Special Meeting on November 4th, the Jackson Hole Airport Board scheduled the upcoming runway reconstruction project for the spring of 2022. The project will require a runway closure from April through June 2022. Specific closure dates will be announced soon.

From April through June 2022, the Airport will be closed to both airline and general aviation operations.

This project is budgeted at \$44 million, with most of the funding coming from grants by the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) and the State of Wyoming Division of Aeronautics.

No local sales or property tax monies are being used to support this project.

The Board also gave direction to proceed with the initial designs of two future terminal improvement projects, that will be further evaluated once design work is completed.

The Security Screening Checkpoint will be remodeled to provide additional screening area, improved passenger flow and to accommodate the next generation of security screening equipment.

Additionally, the restaurant area will be updated to accommodate more seating and expanded kitchen facilities. These improvements will double the square footage of the restaurant and enhance circulation.

“We have been anticipating a runway project for a number of years and it is due for a full reconstruction. The runway is a critical part of the transportation infrastructure and it is important that it be maintained to the highest standards. While the runway is being reconstructed, it has created a potential opportunity to complete two important terminal projects while the runway is closed,” stated Jerry Blann, President of the Jackson Hole Airport Board.
